The Minor Prophets Jonah

- 1. Written 770 during reign of Jehoash
- 2. Jonah 1 Word of the Lord came...
- 3. Jonah fled to Tarshish (other direction from Ninevah)
- 4. Jonah thrown into sea
- 5. Lord prepares a fish
- 6. Jonah prophesies against Ninevah (Day of the Lord...)
- 7. City repents in sackcloth
 - a. People repent hoping God relents
 - b. Jonah didn't even tell them to repent
 - c. People responded in repentance to the Day of the Lord (per Joel 2:12-13)
- 8. Jonah is displeased and angry
 - a. Jonah 4:1–3 (ESV) 1 But it displeased Jonah exceedingly, and he was angry. 2 And he prayed to the LORD and said, "O LORD, is not this what I said when I was yet in my country? That is why I made haste to flee to Tarshish; for I knew that you are a gracious God and merciful, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love, and relenting from disaster. 3 Therefore now, O LORD, please take my life from me, for it is better for me to die than to live."
- 9. Jonah waits for destruction to see if it will happen and gets angry about death of a plant
 - a. **Jonah 4:9–11 (ESV) 9** But God said to Jonah, "Do you do well to be angry for the plant?" And he said, "Yes, I do well to be angry, angry enough to die." **10** And the LORD said, "You pity the plant, for which you did not labor, nor did you make it grow, which came into being in a night and perished in a night. **11** And should not I pity Nineveh, that great city, in which there are more than 120,000 persons who do not know their right hand from their left, and also much cattle?"
